  - Public Affairs Director Hiring still in process, interviews taking place on Friday
  - Development Director hiring still in process. Offered the job to the one qualified candidate who took another job in the meantime.
  - Marti is working full time at PSU, meeting Friday to discuss the archive position and what to do
- Program openings
  - Morning Talk show - former positively revolting
  - 2 monthly folk show openings
  - Queer Boo looking for other hosts
  - Soon - late night music shows
  - Soon - monthly poetry show
- Got equipment to restock field recording kits

Althea: Debrief day at the beginning of the year, pre-empted, so as to cover everything that happened that was actually important, and focus on different issue areas that may not have gotten enough attention for its impact

Paul: Focus on the impacts of the Trump presidency on this AREA, potentially framing with decolonization, looking at lived experience underneath the “issues,” talk about state and local level issues

Erin: Can also spotlight the “Trump bump,” what was able to get done because of the certain sense of urgency that was had? Non-profits got more \$, abortion is well protected in Oregon.

Paul: Frame our efforts around KBOO’s strengths, in this case the LOCAL and our network.

Althea: We talked previously about doing themed months around different policy areas

Erin: Healthcare, climate change, immigration, education etc.
