Meeting Guidelines

- 9. Do not share another person's story without their permission
- 10. Expect mistakes, but be accountable and stay committed to each relationship and to the work
- 11. <u>It is every group member's responsibility to uphold the meeting guidelines, and to stay focused on the topic/agenda.</u> If the group strays from these principles, say "process check" outloud or in the chat to pause the discussion and get the meeting back on track. The process-check sign is not to be misused.

- Program Schedule Updates
 - Retiring
 - Pacific Northwest Tunes 2nd Sundays, 8-10pm
 - Last show was 12/8/24
 - Another Late Night 1st Saturdays, 3am 6am
 - Last Show was 1/4/25
- On-air Contract Update
 - Got put on hold, but prioritizing now. Will be getting input from our FCC lawyers in the coming weeks.
 - Once the on-air contract is complete, Gov. and Policy can move forward on updating the general Volunteer Handbook.
- Upcoming Project
 - Azia plans to meet with each program host starting in April or May
 - Plan to get everyone on the same page regarding programmer expectations, on-air policy, etc
- Applications
 - Have been de-prioritized with increased workload in recent months, will be prioritizing this week
 - Should emphasize local programs over syndicated content
 - Concern that we get many applications from non-volunteers
 - Other stations have application periods
 - A month to go through applications, a month to train
 - Ideally, people should train first, then apply for a show
 - KBOO doesn't seem to get as many applications as other stations (our applications are rolling, not once or twice a year)
 - What can PAC do to help expedite the project to implement the sunsetting of shows?
 - Group of people to help with training, application review, and evals
 - Increase PAC membership and seek to expand diversity on PAC

Public Comments (limit 3 mins per participant)

- Ethan Skarl: Put together a list of folks from other media who present news and issues for PAC/The Programming Department to consider. Asking if anything grabs us from the list. Not saying we need to do X at this point, but what should Ethan pursue?
 - Ethan will work on getting some news training and start small with some of the interview guests he's interested in.
 - Reruns of Alternative Radio could be used as substitutions
